We have successfully conducted ceramic workshops for all the designated age groups. Furthermore, we ensured the inclusion of national minorities by collaborating with Voksenopplæringssenteret in Sandvika and conducting sessions at the Polish School in Oslo. Additionally, workshops were provided to first and seventh-grade students at Vollen Montessori Skole, achieving a well-rounded demographic representation among the workshop participants.





The culmination of our program was marked by the final workshops held during the Oslo Open Weekend 2024 at the artist's studio. These sessions were attended by local families with children from diverse national backgrounds, including but not limited to Norwegian, Polish, Italian, South African, Mozambican, British, Swedish, and Kenyan, with the age range of the children being 1 to 11 years old. The event garnered significant interest from the local families residing in the Vestre Aker/Holmenkollen area, which is predominantly Norwegian-born.





The community has voiced a strong desire for the continuation of such events, citing a lack of family-inclusive activities in the vicinity.

In response to the positive feedback and the discernible impact on the community, we are committed to organizing such events biannually, thereby enriching the cultural fabric of this residential area.
